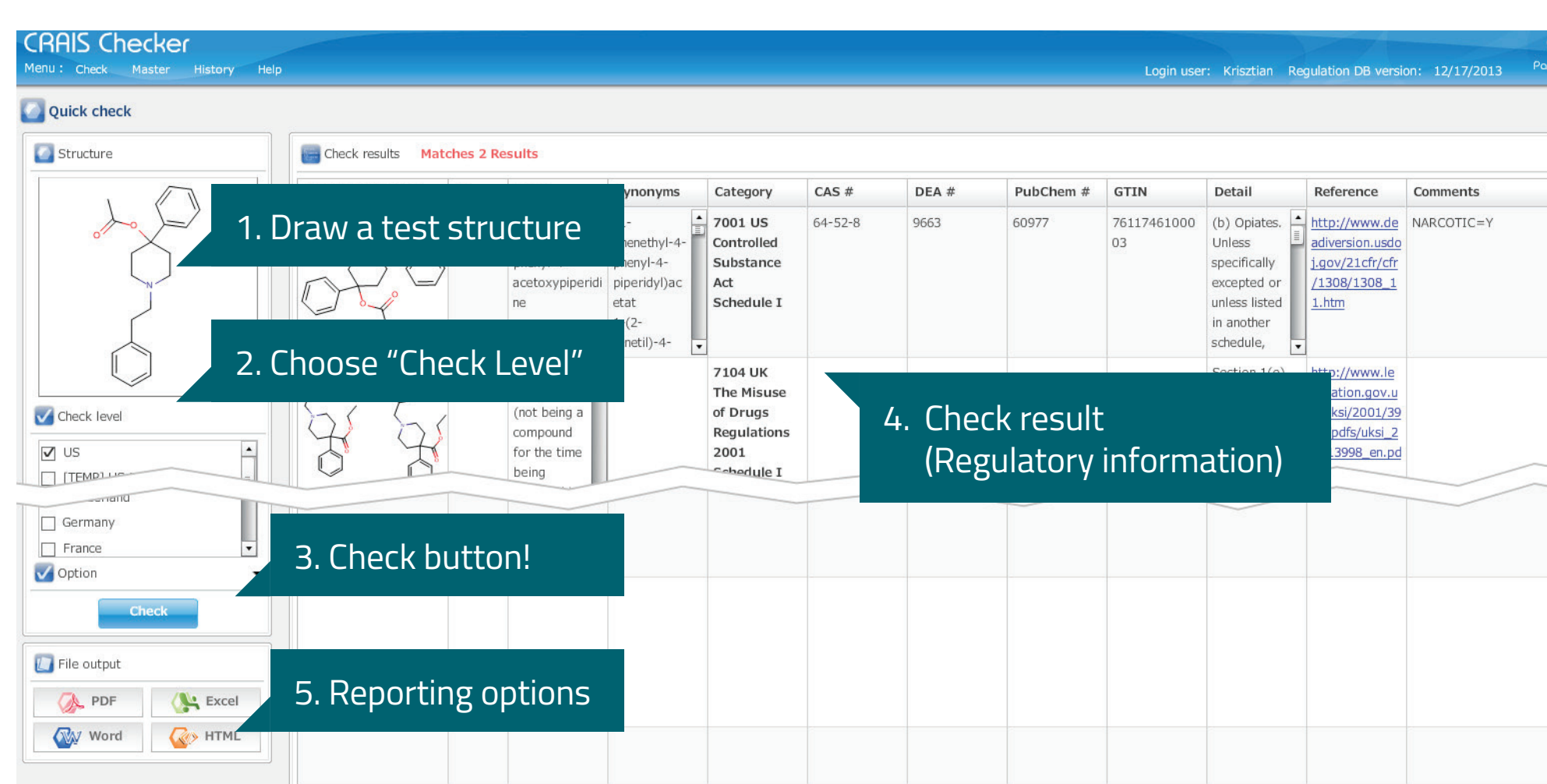


Compliance Checker: A simple compliance tool that helps you stay on the safe side

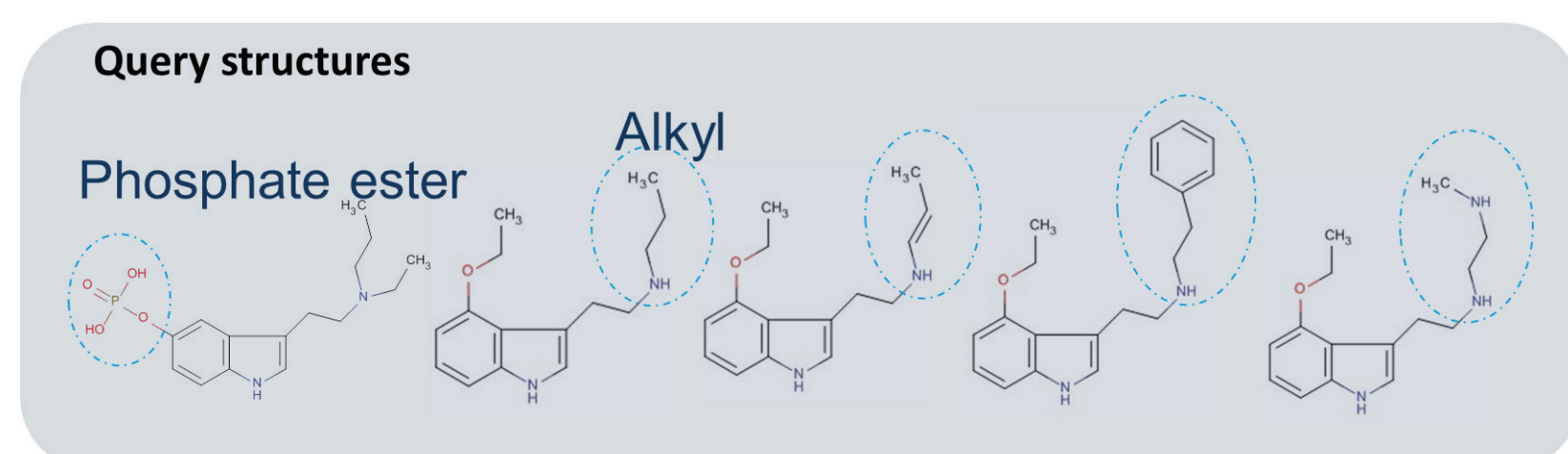

Background:

- Today, company compliance is one of the most important business management challenges.
- To date there are no tools that could efficiently allow responsible people to track regulatory changes.
- There is a need to be able easily identify and follow legislation information globally and to take the appropriate steps before starting your synthesis, or before purchasing reagents, importing/exporting compounds.
- Compliance Checker is a Software/Content system to check whether the chemical compounds in question fall under any local, national or international laws and regulations.
